Fish

Fish are animals that live in water and can swim. All fish have a backbone, gills and fins.

The oceans cover more than two-thirds of the earth. Where there is life in the ocean, you will find fish. Fish live, swim, breathe and breed under water.

The bodies of fish are made for life under water. Smooth bodies, fins and strong tails make swimming easy. The gills on a fish work like our lungs. The fish takes in water through its mouth and the gills **absorb** the oxygen from the water.



Bony Fish

The most common fish are bony fish. Bony fish have skeletons and jaws made of bone. Scales cover their bodies. Tuna, salmon and goldfish are all bony fish with fanlike fins.

Bony fish can stop swimming and not sink to the bottom. Inside each fish is a swim bladder that contains air, like a balloon. The fish can inflate the swim bladder to float higher in the water or deflate it to swim into deeper water.
